Changes of seasons always beg the question, "Where did that summer [winter, spring...] go?" For several reasons, the summer seemed to go by exceedingly quickly this year. Here we are at the end of summer, at the start of new school and choral years, about to embark on this new string of opportunities to grow in our faith and our musicianship.

In a way, there is always some degree of excitement at the start of something new. As a choir director, I have new goals for myself and the choir in learning new repertoire or finally mastering a vocal technique we've been working on. After a few rehearsals though,

It's not easy though, so frequent practice is important – both personal preparation and that weekly choir practice! I'll admit (shh! Don't tell my choir!) that there are always one or two Thursday nights where the last thing I want to do is run rehearsal. But the joke's on me – those usually end up being the most fruitful rehearsals, and I always feel better at the end.

NPM has always had at its heart the mission of a "musical liturgy." This is true, too, at the chapter level. The boards of NPM Arlington and NPM D.C. have worked this summer to line up an incredible year of programming to, hopefully, benefit us all. The full calendar is later in the newsletter, but I'd like to highlight a couple of events here.

Our major event for the year will be jointly hosted by the two chapters in March. We're pleased to bring Peter Kolar, Director of the El Paso Diocesan Choir and Editor for Spanish and Bilingual Resources at GIA Publications, to present an evening concert and a full-day workshop for Spanish speaking musicians and those who work with them. This will be an exciting opportunity for those who regularly (or occasionally) provide musical leadership for Spanish language liturgies.

This November, our annual NPM Arlington Liturgy Day will focus on the National Eucharistic Revival. Msgr. Ray East, priest of the Archdiocese of Washington, D.C. and long-time NPM member and friend, will present on the Eucharist as the Source and Summit of our lives. We'll have a couple of breakout sessions that day as well. This will be an amazing opportunity for liturgical and musical formation not to be missed!


