Director's Corner

"What time is it, church?!" the deacon would call out around this time every year during his homily.

"It's Jesus time!" the assembly would reverberate.

Yes, we did re-enter Ordinary Time the day after Pentecost, and we're just now emerging from May's steady onslaught of Sunday solemnities. Indeed, Ordinary Time – or "Jesus time" as declared by Deacon Steve Morello, visiting homilist to our parish from the Archdiocese of Detroit – is open for business.

Of course, "Jesus time" is 24/7. But what the deacon focused on was for us to look at Christ's life outside the solemnities and feasts and penitential seasons of the liturgical year. Our Latin roots call upon the term *Ordinary* to indicate those Sundays that are numbered, not today's rendering of *ordinary* as *usual*, *customary* and *unimportant*.

These last 12 months have been anything but ordinary, punctuated by Pope Francis' visit to Washington last fall. Just ask members of our local NPM chapter boards and our general membership who had any roles in the planning and execution surrounding the Holy Father's trip here.

But here now in "Jesus time," we pastoral musicians look forward to June, July and August for brief or extended periods of respite and relaxation away from the rigors of the responsibilities of our ministries. Choirs take a break. Music and choir directors step back and away from relentless schedules so they can resuscitate and re-energize.

Some of us are attending the NPM convention in Houston and other regional or national gatherings to recharge our liturgical batteries. We may even finally get time to individually review those samples of octavos and publishers' planning materials that have patiently awaited our attention.

This summer also offers at least two excellent local opportunities to sing through new choral music and seasonal favorites at the Cathedral of St. Thomas More in Arlington, VA. See page 5 for details

"Jesus time" also might let us investigate new ways to engage our Year of Mercy in coming liturgies.

And finally, we stand poised to spend some quiet time with the Lord, because that too fits nicely in these days of "Jesus time."
